Masjid Development Proposal Progress & Planning Challenges

As-salaamu 'alaykum wa Rahmatullah,

We are pleased to update our beloved community on the progress and ongoing challenges regarding the Masjid Amendment Proposal for our property at 97 Bartok Court, Narre Warren South, purchased in August 2023.

Comprehensive Reports Submitted

To support our application, we submitted

eight professional reports

to the City of Casey:

- 1. Planning Report
- 2. Traffic Impact Assessment
- 3. Acoustic Report
- 4. Waste Management Plan
- 5. Stormwater and Drainage Report
- 6. Bushfire Management Statement (if applicable)
- 7. Landscape Design Plan
- 8. Community Needs

These submissions demonstrated both the need and the readiness of our project to serve the community effectively and responsibly.

Initial Approval & Sudden Setbacks

The interim council accepted our application and approved it through all major

planning stages. We were finalising conditions when a newly elected council and a new planning department team revisited the proposal.

New concerns were unexpectedly raised:

- Reposition the building away from neighbours
- Move the car park behind
- Eliminate three classrooms

We complied with all requests. Blur Architecture resubmitted the revised plans accordingly. However, the council has now requested that we reduce the entire building back to the original church's size — a drastic move that would eliminate essential facilities such as the library, cafeteria, and sufficient classrooms.

Why an Amendment Was Necessary?

Following the purchase, we engaged **Blur Architecture**, a

leading

architectural firm, and professional town planners to assist with the application to amend the use of the existing building from a church to a purpose-built mosque. The current structure presented several challenges:

We therefore proposed a new mosque design which includes:

A Qiblah aligned prayer space 🕥

Additional facilities:library, cafeteria, classrooms

A significantly improved car park layout

Strategic Advocacy

In light of these issues, we have reached out to key stakeholders:

- Held a productive meeting with Mayor of Casey, Councillor Stefan Koomen
- Met with Local MP Gary Maas, who was supportive and understanding
- Scheduled additional meetings with other local MPs

We continue to advocate respectfully and diligently to ensure our application is fairly assessed and aligned with community needs.

3. Inequity with Other Churches

The nearby Casey Christian Reformed Church, located on the same street, is approximately five times larger than the original church we purchased. Our proposed facility remains significantly smaller by comparison.
